The name of the Society is ABBOTSFORD POLICE FOUNDATION

The purposes of the Society are:

1. To gift funds to other registered charities or organizations that are otherwise qualified donees as defined in subsection 149.1(1) of the *Income Tax Act* and that further the objects of the Society;
2. To develop, promote and support programs that educate the local community concerning law enforcement;
3. To promote community partnerships that encourage excellence in policing for the City of Abbotsford;
4. To emphasize the role of the police in the local community;
5. To encourage community awareness of the social impact of crime and the various methods of preventing crime;
6. To do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects and in particular:
 - (i) to engage in fundraising activities, as beforehand deemed acceptable by the Abbotsford Police Board and that are acceptable to the Charities Directorate;
 - (ii) to sell goods and services for the purpose of raising funds for the use of the Society, and to procure and obtain authority to conduct charitable gaming events, and to do all acts, deeds and things necessary or incidental to the conduct of such activities;
 - (iii) to employ and remunerate workers, consultants, administrative staff and other people and to retain legal counsel, accountants and auditors as may be required for the purposes aforesaid;
 - (iv) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, and to hold, manage, develop, finance, lease, operate, dispose or deal with any real or personal property of all kinds and wheresoever situate and to construct, erect, alter, improve, demolish and maintain any real property and to enter into all transactions and execute all agreements, transfers and other documents as may from time to time be required in

- connection with such property, whether acquired by endowment or purchase and whether for investment or carrying out the purposes and activities of the Society;
- (v) to receive and maintain endowments on the terms and conditions established by the donor, including receiving property or cash received subject to a trust or direction to the effect that the property given, or property substituted therefor is to be held for a period of not less than 10 years;
 - (vi) to use, apply, give, devote, accumulate or apply from time to time all or part of the fund or funds of the Society and/or income therefrom for charitable purposes, inter alia as defined in the *Income Tax Act* of Canada which, in the judgement of the directors of the Society, will promote the purposes of the Society;
 - (vii) to invest any funds of the Society, not immediately required for any of its objects, in such manner or on such security as may from time to time be determined by the directors of the Society to be advisable, and the directors shall not be limited to making investments in which trustees are authorized to invest by law;
 - (viii) to prepare, edit, print, publish, issue, acquire and circulate or distribute books, papers, periodicals and other literary materials and films and mechanical and other models and equipment relating to the purposes of the Society; to disseminate any such information as aforesaid and encourage interest in and support for the purposes of the Society;
 - (ix) to sell, let, manage, lease, dispose of, or turn to account all or any of the property or assets of the Society in furtherance of its purposes, subject to the terms of any endowment received by the Society;
 - (x) to pay all expenses, preliminary or incidental to the formation of the Society and its registration;
 - (xi) to undertake, execute and perform any charitable trusts which may lawfully be undertaken by the Society and may be conducive to its purposes;
 - (xii) to raise funds to promote the purposes of the Society and to solicit, receive and accept financial assistance, donations, endowments, gifts (both inter vivos and testamentary), devises, bequests and loans of money, rents, hereditaments and other property whatsoever, real or personal, and subject or not to any specific charitable trusts or conditions; and
 - (xiii) to do all such other lawful and charitable things for the purposes of attaining the above purposes or any of them.
